Early Years - Reception

All about Me

Class 4 children have settled well into full time school in their new reception class and are already starting to understand the daily routine and class expectations. The children have shared a selection of stories including 'We all have belly buttons' and '10 little fingers and 10 little toes'. In communication and language, they were focusing on following instructions using the doll's house and washing dolls. We had fun painting with our hands and feet in Expressive arts and design and getting to know Nicola who comes to do some music sessions with us. It was great fun when we were able to explore shaving foam and jelly with our hands in Understanding of the World.



























Key Stage 1

We are all very proud of how well the children have settled into the new term!

In Literacy we have studied the text 'Someone Bigger' by Jonathan Emmett. This story requires help from the people in the town and animals to try and get the kite down. The children have focused on sequencing and retelling the story, recounting a journey and exploring the characters. In Maths, the children have learnt about counting and number through number songs and rhymes, and size through practical activities. The children have learnt about their bodies and exploring their senses in Knowledge, Skills and Understanding of the World. In addition to this, the children have looked at using different tools to help them make and design kites. In Expressive Arts, the children have learnt about exploring sounds through listening to songs about movement and within our music sessions led by Nicola. In PSHECC the children have explored the topic of self-awareness: the development of a sense of individual identity, using their senses and thinking about what makes them unique.

Lower Key Stage 2

Our theme this next half term has been "Location, Location, Location" and we explored this through Knowledge, Skills and Understanding of the World and Expressive Arts. We investigated our school and the local area and looked at famous interior designers including Laura Ashley and Charles Renee Mackintosh creating our own wallpapers to decorate and design our own houses.

In our literacy lessons we explored the text 'This Is Our House' by Michael Rosen looked at following and giving instructions to complete set tasks. In Maths the children have continued to develop their number skills through songs, games, challenges and written tasks. We explored number, addition and subtraction and positional vocabulary.

In PSHECC our focus this half term has been selfawareness, looking after ourselves and looking at what we are good at.

Subways and Skyscrapers

UKS2 children have had a great first half term. Our exciting topic, 'Subways and Skyscrapers' has been focused on key architecture in New York with a comparison to Worcester. In Literacy our focus text has been 'James and The Giant Peach' by Roald Dahl. The children have enjoyed retelling the story through role play, exploring the different characters, and creating their own settings and character profiles for their own stories. In topic the children have been designing and making skyscrapers! In maths they have explored number and practised their counting skills, explored addition, subtraction and contrasting quantities. The children have also explored weight.
