Early Years - Reception

Nursery Rhymes

In EYFS this half term the children had lots of fun learning through Nursery Rhymes. The children explored the rhymes with props and chose their favourite one as part of literacy. They explored big and small bowls and spoons and counted currant buns in maths. In communication and language, they listened to the rhymes and selected named objects. The children explored lots of different media including cake ingredients and fish in water. They also did mark making with a range of tools, painted cakes and made playdough spiders.



















Key Stage 1

Minibeast Safari

What a busy half term! The 'Minibeast Safari' topic has enabled the children to learn all about a variety of insects and minibeasts in their environment. They have been busy hunting for insects during outdoor learning, creating butterfly prints, exploring clay, as well as finding creepy crawlies in sensory materials! The key text has been 'What the ladybird heard' and the children have looked at nonfiction texts too. In Maths they have been comparing heights and lengths, along with lots of number work and games. In Topic the children have explored sound through instruments, used paints and created sculptures. In PHSECC they have been learning about being healthy with lots of exercise and healthy food tasting.

Lower Key Stage 2

It's been another busy half term in LKS2! In Literacy the children have been reading the story 'The Leopard's Drum' and studying poetry using 'Rumble in the Jungle'. Maths was all about money, multiplication, division, and estimation. The children continued to develop their number skills through songs, games, challenges, and written tasks. In Topic the children improvised and composed music based on the study of Madagascar and they also learnt about the classification of living things. Using the money raised from our Christmas Fayre we were able to fund a visit from Roaming Reptiles which all the children thoroughly enjoyed!

This half term we also had the opportunity to have a share a story afternoon as well as our Sports Day which was enjoyed by all!



Upper Key Stage 2



'Knock, Knock! Who's There?'

The children learnt about the text 'The Jolly Postman' in literacy focusing on describing and explaining the events of the story through role play and giving descriptions and explanations. They also wrote non-chronological reports, such as letters and postcards and exploring rhyme within the story and linking this to poems. In maths the children explored geometry, shape, number, and place value. As part of topic, they have explored a variety of songs and sounds with opportunity to compose music to create sound stories and explored direction whilst looking at our local community. The children also had fun designing products, such as sewing their own bags or making a teddy bear. UKS2 also enjoyed a fun (and almost dry) sports day with events such as the javelin, egg and spoon and relay race. It was lots of fun for all involved.

A big THANK YOU to all who helped organise Arts Week



On Friday we had Anjali Dance Company to create some fun dances; they are a Birmingham based company whose dancers have SEND and have performed all over the world.


